Wild Turkeys in the Kootenays By: Vic Boychuk

Wild turkeys in BC are non-native, the same as partridge, pheasant, quail, rainbow trout in Region 4 and the plains bison in Northern BC.

The wild turkey is a species of bird native to the United States. There are six subspecies two of which have populations in Canada: the Eastern wild turkey and Merriam's wild turkey. The Eastern wild turkey is native to southern Ontario and Quebec, while Merriam's wild turkey was introduced to Manitoba in 1958 and to Alberta in 1962. Merriam's wild turkey can also be found in Saskatchewan.

In the 1960s Merriam's wild turkey naturally came from the northwestern United States to Southern British Columbia.

The strongest population of wild turkeys are in the Kootenays where hunters take over 600 turkeys annually. There is a small population in the southeastern Okanagan.


Wild turkeys are big and tasty (up to 25lbs), so they have a long list of predators, from cougars and coyotes to eagles and owls. They learn early in life to be alert and run or fly away at any sign of danger, and that includes humans.

When displaying their fantail, males ("Toms" or "Gobblers" as they are known) appear almost twice their size and the call they make to attract females is known as a gobble. Female turkeys are called "hens." They do not have fantails, and although they may have the same colors as toms, the colors are much duller. Wild turkeys mostly inhabit forests but often wander into open fields and grasslands to feed, nest and reproduce. At night they fly up into the trees to roost. Wild turkeys are not fussy eaters, they eat seeds, hazelnuts, oak nuts, hickory nuts, beech nuts, acorns, apples, fruit, snails, worms, and any bug that moves. Turkeys nest on the ground, at the base of trees, in areas that provide some form of cover from above. Hens often reposition their eggs in order to make sure all surface areas receive adequate body heat. Wild turkey hatchlings are born fully developed and by 14 weeks they've developed their distinctive male and female plumage.


Turkeys can see very well. A turkey's eyes are located on the sides of their head and that gives them about 300 degrees of view. There is a small blind spot directly behind, but with a slight head movement, that is also covered. They can see in full color and their eyes are sensitive to motion. At 300 feet, turkeys can spot a hunter blinking his eyes. Turkeys can also see the ultraviolet end of the light spectrum. The phosphates in laundry soap brightens the colors, so it makes hunters extra visible to a bird that can see UV light. With their eyes placed on the sides of their head, their sight is monocular (compared to a human's binocular vision). They see you, but they're not sure how far away you are.

They make such a variety of sounds that a sense of hearing is important. Most mammals have cuplike external ears to help gather sound, but the turkey has a hole just behind and below their eyes, which leads to the ear canal. The ear holes are covered with fine hairs that cut down on wind noise yet allow sound waves to pass through. Without the cuplike ear parts, the turkeys hear sounds from all around them. The difference in the volume in each ear helps determine the direction of a sound. This system is quite accurate, and they can turn their head to look toward whatever made the sound. Turkeys can hear possibly four times better than us humans. So, for new turkey hunters, it is important to be still and be quiet, but thanks to a turkey's poor sense of smell it is less important to have had your morning shower.

In British Columbia, wild turkeys are classified as upland birds (small game) with other species like grouse, pheasant, partridge, and quail. Across the border wild turkeys are classified as big game. Turkey hunting is still quite localized in BC, but in the US, with millions of these birds, turkey hunting is a passion.

LIVER & GALL BLADDER CLEANSE







ROCK CREEK COMMUNITY MEDICAL SOCIETY


